Registration for College Electives: Except those marked with an asterisk (**), you can register for all college electives on line in ISIS.

Courses Marked with an Asterisk **:

- *HSC 4930 Case Management:* RES students will be registered by the Dean's Office for the case management course. If you are a health science or pre-OT student and want this course as an elective, please e-mail Ethel Sharp esharp@php.ufl.edu, who will keep a list for registration.
- *RCS 4800/4804 Practicum:* If you plan to take RCS 4800 or 4804 this semester, please see Ms. Eileen Phillips in the Department of Behavioral Science and Community Health (HPNP 4160). She will be registering all students for the rehabilitative services practicum courses.
- *HSC 4905 (Individual Study) or HSC 3801 (Clinical Observation):* If you are interested in taking HSC 4905 or HSC 3801, an informational packet can be accessed on the program website www.bahealthsci.php.ufl.edu under "Current Students." The Dean's Office will register you for these courses once your contract has been approved.
- *HSC 4418/4418L Nervous System:* Non pre-OT track students who want to take OTH 4418 and 4418L should follow the instructions already sent via e-mail. We will continue to use the Wait List to fill spaces created by any students dropping the course. The course is full at this time.

Students in the Honors Sequence (applies to rising seniors only): We (Dean's Office) will register you for 3 credits of HSC 4970 for the Fall. After you complete your official honors project contract this summer with your project mentor, the credits will be adjusted if different from 3.

Minor in Public Health: If you have declared a minor in Public Health, the Dean's Office will register you for your public health courses. The 3 core classes offered Fall semester are: Statistical Methods for Health Sciences I, Principles of Epidemiology, and Psychological, Behavioral & Social Issues in Public Health.
