Final Exam Week: December 12, 14-18

If you have a conflict with another exam and need to schedule a make up or another alternative, as specified by the instructor, **you must contact your instructor at least one week PRIOR to the exam to be eligible to make up the test.** If you are ill on the day of the exam, you must contact the instructor **PRIOR** to the time the exam is scheduled to begin. If you are unable to reach the instructor, contact the Dean's Office **PRIOR** to the exam and clearly state that you are ill and what exam you have. We will require a valid medical excuse for you to be eligible to make up the exam. The only other acceptable excuses to warrant a make up exam are those recognized by UF (e.g. family emergency), and you must still notify us PRIOR to the exam start time to be eligible for the make up. It is your responsibility to talk directly with the instructor or his or her secretary in advance. **Failure to do so will result in a zero on the exam.** Do not rely on someone else or e-mail to send a message.
